In April, 1945, 26 outstanding civic and community-minded individuals formed the Jamestown Lions Club. Charter members were Howard Fairley, John C. Ferguson, Charles Fudge, R. L. Haines, MD, Edward Irons, Robert Moorman, Milton Oliver, Roy Powers, Charles Rutter, A. D. Ritenour, MD, Willard Thuma, Vernon Stafford, Harold Lewis, Marion Burr, Andrew Grapevine, Leslie Abersole, Earl Gibbs, Clarence Boger, Richard Smith, Clay Mauck, Marston Claire, Rodney Roberts, Guy Garman, A. Y. Whitehead, DDS, Elmo Higham and Max Powers. Official Charter from Lions International was received April 12 of that year. 12 men held the following offices: President Clarence Boger, 1st VP Max Powers, 2nd VP Robert Moorman, 3rd VP Howard Fairley, Secretary John Ferguson, Treasurer Lawson Reid, Lion Tamer Dr. A. Y. Whitehead, Tail Twister Robert Moorman and Directors: Earl Gibbs, Andrew Grapevine, Clay Mauck, Willard Thuma.

Lion President Boger suggested a Fall Carnival as the first public event sponsored the Jamestown Lions Club. Director Mauck said, "If we are going to have a carnival, let's do it right and have it on the streets." There was a parade with bands, floats and spectators standing in the rain to watch. The net cash amount of \$650.00 was used for eye glasses for the school children in Bowersville, Jamestown and Ross Twp. During December 1945, Christmas food baskets were delivered to needy families, That got the Club off to a great start!

By 1948, the Jamestown Lions Club had sponsored new clubs in Bowersville and Jeffersonville, A western horse show became a hugh draw and was of high quality in every respect. Each year saw more projects funded by the JLC including a new ball diamond at Silvercreek School, paying for more than 400 doses of Sabin Polio Vaccine, supporting the Jamestown Volunteer Fire Department and continuing to provide food baskets at Christmas for needy families in the greater Jamestown area. 1966 was the Sesquicentennial year for Jamestown. Lions members were the core group that provided the leadership for this historic celebration and it was first class. Many Jamestown Lions have served in key positions throughout the various levels of leadership in Lions International, including District Governors and hosting 13-J District Conventions.

A triple tornado ripped through Xenia, Ohio in April 1974 with over 30 fatalities and horrendous damage, wiping out huge areas of the city and surrounding areas, as it hit Bellbrook and followed a NE track exiting Greene County. The Jamestown Lions Club decided to make an effort to provide assistance in the aftermath, as not only Lions, but many residents volunteered for weeks to man food kitchens, provide physical assistance via street patrols at night and helping in the clean-up and reconstruction efforts. The Club decided to present a fund-raising production entitled "Eeh-Wah" in the format of the popular TV show "Hee-Haw" which was not only fun to develop but was truly a smash hit and well done. The net proceeds were donated to the Xenia Tornado Relief Fund. The show was very successful and served as the catalyst for future "Dinner Theatre" events in subsequent years.

1982 saw the carnival become an official "Ohio Festival Event" as the Bean Festival, featuring "Jimmy the Bean" as the face of the event was registered with the state of Ohio. An expanded group of events was developed including the Grand Parade, crowning of the Queen and her court, Friday night acution of donated merchandise, ham and bean dinner served each afternoon and evening, along with the traditional contests, games and raffle on Saturday night for the various cash prizes. From 1976-1985, the Jamestown Lions Club donated more than \$7,600.00 supporting the Ohio Lions Eye Bank, Eye Research, School for the Hearing impaired, Echo Hills Camp for the handicapped and international disaster victims relief. In 1990, past District Governor Lion Kenneth Talbott of the JLC received a most prestigious award from Ohio State Lions Pilot Dogs, Inc. This organization assists the blind in many ways, including, of course, companion "Pilot Dogs".

The list of activities and accomplishments of the dedicated members of the Jamestown Lions Club goes on and on. The motto of Lions International is "WE SERVE". Jamestown Lions live this theme every day in ways too numerous to list. This document would require several more pages to compile. The Jamestown, Ohio greater community of Jefferson, Ross and Silvercreek Townships receive various forms of contributions from the JLC throughout each year. As the Jamestown Lions Club celebrates its 70th anniversary year, the citizens of Jamestown and surrounding communities are grateful, thankful and blessed to enjoy the benefits of public-spirited activities and events resulting from the efforts of the Jamestown Lions Club. We sincerely say----THANK YOU!!!!!!!!

We continue to strive for funding for the elevator. With each event, the need becomes more apparent as 40-50 people who wish to attend are unable to climb the 3 levels of stairs. We have approximately one half the cost of the elevator. We are grateful for the continued support of friends of the Opera House.
